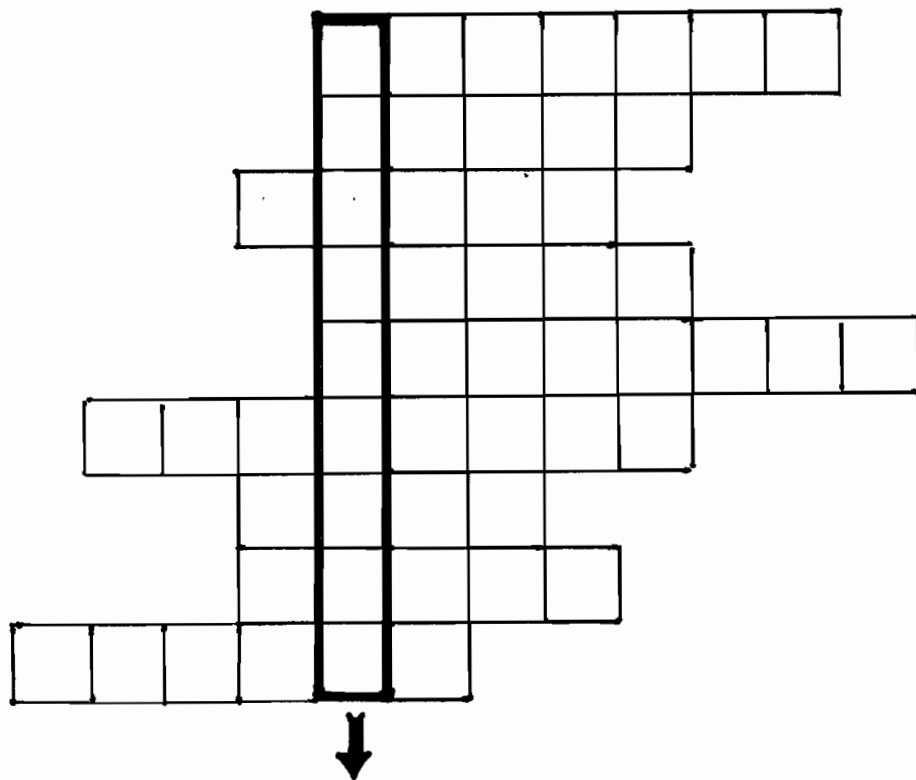

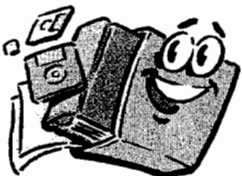


Dear Sue!

clothes. Mary and Peter hadn't seen like him before. Mary was afraid but they followed him out in the desert to find water. In the

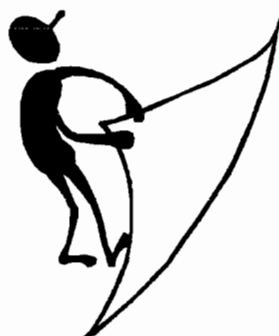
evening the children looked for wood and made a fire to cook the wallaby. Then the Aborigine did

strange. He danced in a very wild way but Mary didn't understand

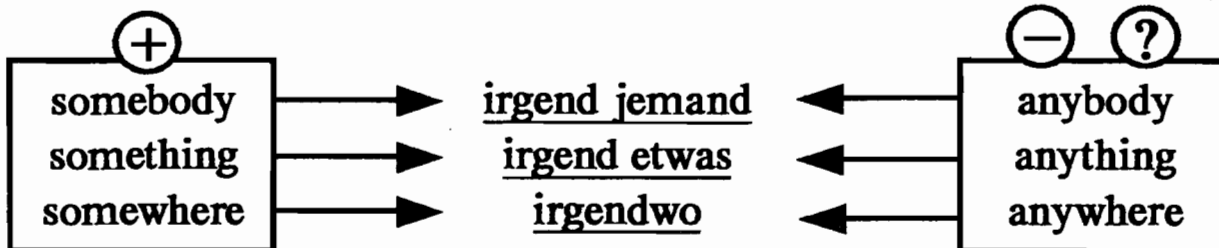
